

Caution: Ohio Revised Code Section 2921.15 states, "no person shall knowingly file a complaint against a peace officer that alleges that the peace officer engaged in misconduct in the performance of the officer's duties if the person knows that the allegation is false." Violation of this law is a first-degree misdemeanor.

You should be aware that we do not condone false or groundless complaints and if the charges are fraudulent, the accused employee has the right to pursue a criminal or civil action against you.

Citizen Complaint Procedure

The Jackson Township Police Department strives to provide the citizens of Jackson Township with the highest level of professional conduct possible. Our office will treat citizen complaints against employees very seriously.

The Jackson Township Police Department will thoroughly investigate any matter that might affect the efficient, professional operations of the Department.

After a thorough investigation, the Chief of Police will notify the citizen of the outcome of the investigation, in most cases within 45 days of receiving the complaint. If we find evidence of misconduct, we will take proper action against the employee.

Citizens wanting to file a complaint can write a letter to the Chief of Police, stop by the office Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., contact the on-duty officer by calling (937) 696-2444, or you can contact the Chief of Police at (937) 696-2522.
